She represents Mississippi on the National Compendium of State-Run Anti-Trafficking Initiatives in the United States. MS Lucas is a certified law enforcement training instructor through the Board of Law Enforcement Standards and Training. MS Lucas sits on the Board of Directors of Reshma's Home. Reshma's Home is a house for girls rescued and secured out of the sex trade, streets and impoverished villages in southeast Asia.
